To earn the MSP certification requires individuals to meet specified eligibility requirements, pass a rigorous 150 question exam, meet the recertification requirements, and uphold the Certificant's Code of Ethics and Professional Standards Agreement, Candidate's Non-Disclosure and Confidentiality Agreement, and Criminal Conviction and Unethical Behavior Agreement as set forth by the NASP/IASP, Inc. Certification Board.

Certification Board.
